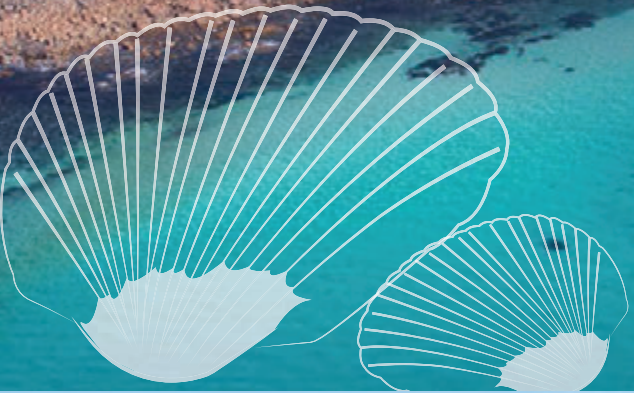
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# Strategic Plan 2023-2025





## Guiding Principles

- Protection of the environmental, social, cultural and economic values in the PNP region.
- Integrated planning and decision making based on principles of the precautionary principle and Integrated Coastal Zone Management.
- Sustainable use of coastal and estuarine resources.
- Appropriate and meaningful public participation.
- The priority for public expenditure is public benefit; public expenditure should cost effectively achieve the best practical long-term outcomes.
- Adopt a risk management approach to address potential adverse impacts of coastal hazards.
- Adopt adaptive and flexible adaption pathways to make allowances for increasing risks over time and / or to accommodate uncertainty.
- Maintain and improve safe public access to beaches and support sustainable recreational activities.



## Implementation

### Objective

Communicate coastal climate change matters to Member Local Governments, stakeholders and the community.

Advocate the need for effective leadership, legislation, funding, and guidance on coastal climate change adaptation.

Identify and develop research partnerships with relevant organizations and agencies.

### Key Actions Planned

Provide regular updates to Member Local Governments on relevant coastal matters.

Present to Member Local Governments and at relevant conferences and public forums.

Develop and distribute e-newsletter every quarter.

Manage and update PNP website.

Communicate the need for effective coastal legislation, policies and guidance with Federal and State Government.

Seek support and sustainable long-term resourcing from Federal and State Governments.

Promote the PNP and our activities.

Provide comment on relevant Government planning, policy, legislation and activities.

Seek opportunities to partner with research institutions and State Government agencies to undertake research in the region.

Apply for relevant funding and implement research projects.
